Does the Delta Variant (COVID-19 mutant) Pose a Threat to You? by Dr. Robin Kelley, Health Ministry

What is the Delta Variant?

There is a great deal of discussion about the Delta variant, but what is this? Viruses mutate the more that they circulate from person-to-person, and when COVID-19 mutated in India, it resulted in the Delta strain of the virus. (To mutate means to change from the original configuration to something else. The change could be something tiny, but any change could make the virus more dangerous and MAY make a vaccine less likely to be effective in preventing extreme sickness or death.) This mutated form of the original virus is highly contagious. It has a 50% higher transmission rate than the UK mutation of the virus, which had a 40-60% higher transmission rate than the original virus from China (Scientific America https://www.scientificamerican.com/article/ how-dangerous-is-the-delta-variant-andwill-it-cause-a-covid-surge-in-the-u-s/).

Bad News About the Unvaccinated

More and more, there are variants, and they are becoming more transmissible. Once a variant finds a person that it can inhabit, it takes up residence and then spreads quickly to others who are unprotected. The Delta variant can be fatal; the findings show that it is growing as the predominate strain of COVID in the US, among the unvaccinated. At this point, most people who are hospitalized or who have died, are primarily, those who have not been vaccinated.

Good News for the Vaccinated

The vaccines are protective against serious illness from COVID-19, and its mutations. If fully vaccinated, there is, in most cases a 100% chance that you will not die from the virus. Vaccines are still free and are available through many parts of the country. However, if you have any questions about locating a vaccine distribution center or

about the vaccines in general, or booster shots, check with reputable references, such as the https://www.vaccines.gov/search/, or the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Will I Need a Booster Shot?

There is no data that shows that there is a need for a third or booster shot at any time. The existing vaccines are sufficient. Currently, even with new variants, the vaccinations are effective at keeping one safe from hospitalization and death.

Why Should Masks Still Be Worn if Vaccinated?

Given that there is not a vaccine that is 100% protective against acquiring the virus, masks should still be worn, particularly if:

- There is a great deal of virus in your community, and you are around a number of people.
- You have a compromised immune system or pre-existing conditions and may be around persons whose vaccine status is unknown.
- You are fearful of being exposed and then exposing the virus to your loved ones.

Most of the vaccines are between 70% to 94% to 96% effective which means that 30% to 6% or 4% are vulnerable to getting the virus. Those who are vaccinated may run into complications if they are immunecompromised or have pre-existing conditions or are older and are around a number of persons who are unvaccinated. The virus thrives in areas where people are not protected against it.

For those who live in areas where there is a great deal of the virus, particularly the new Delta variant in your community-check your local health department- it is good for you to continue to wear a mask when indoors, or close to others who may be unvaccinated.

What should you do to protect yourselves and your family against the unvaccinated?

There are three primary things to do:

- Do not panic. Wear a mask when indoors and around someone whose vaccination status is unknown. Make sure the mask covers your mouth and nose.
- 2. Wash your hands frequently or when unable to do so, use hand sanitizer.
- Get fully vaccinated and have those around you get vaccinated as soon as possible*

(*To be fully vaccinated means that one has had all required shots against the COVID-19 virus for 2 weeks after the administration of the final shot)
